We are all aware that some children haven't been in school since the end of March and so our usual settling in period may take longer this year. This Term's Curriculum

Our main topic this term is 'The Circus', including its history; famous circuses; animal acts and welfare; clowns and much more.

In English, we will be revising a lot of Key Stage 2 spelling, phonics and grammar. Our class novel is 'The Nowhere Emporium', and we will incorporate key objectives from Year 5 and 6 into our writing.

Guided reading will focus on figurative language, fluency and understanding of vocabulary across a range of texts.

In maths, lots of work on basic skills and times tables every day besides units on place value, addition and subtraction.

Please do not be alarmed if you think your child is covering some simple maths work to start with. We always go back to basics in Year 6 and, this year especially, we must ensure that gaps are filled before moving on to new learning.
