<u>MATHS</u>	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Bring a paper and pen to the lesson this morning to have a go at some short division questions as a warm up.2. <u>Spelling</u>	<p>Find the meaning of each of these compound adjectives. Think carefully about the use of the hyphen, and how it changes the meaning of the words.
